

## **TOWN OF CADIZ SNOW REMOVAL POLICY**

Our winter snow removal policy recognizes a bare pavement as the ultimate objective, but also realizes that we cannot provide a bare pavement 24 hours a day, every day of the year. In order to efficiently use our resources, we will establish priorities and limit the service during certain situations.

Cadiz roads shall be kept open as soon as possible after any storm. However, during normal working hours, Monday thru Friday, we will plow as necessary to maintain traffic. We will give priority to hard surfaced roads and all roads with main traffic flow. We will apply salt & chips to alleviate pre-determined hazardous areas and during severe freezing rain, conditions to keep roads passable. As soon as possible after a storm, we will try to provide an almost bare pavement near the center of travel portion of the road, and to give traction for traffic in both directions, if possible, at wide intersections, on hills and curves.

The Cadiz Town Board feels that during severe storms, it is not practical to plow or sand until the storm subsides. This means in most cases, plowing operations will begin upon determination of road conditions during snow, sleet, or any other precipitation, considered a hazard. Salt & chips treatment would be limited to very hazardous situations and locations. It would be done during severe freezing rain conditions when roads become impassable after the storm.

The Town Board or Patrolman can be called at any time if an emergency exists during non-working hours. However, the Town will not compete with wrecker services.

Lanes and private driveways will be plowed, on request, after public roads at a price agreed upon by the Cadiz Town Board. (Current pricing is \$25.00 minimum per driveway, with additional minutes after the first 25 minutes billed at \$1.00 per minute)
